Quite possibly the shortest sentence in the Holy Bible, these two words “Jesus Wept” highlight the human nature of Christ, as he began to process the death of his dear friend Lazarus of Bethany. Once Mary and Martha sent word, Jesus arrived too late to see his friend pass, but not too late to see him rise.

The events of yesterday’s tragedy make no sense. Multiple people have died, lives were broken, hearts are aching, and tears are shed. Tears. Tears. Tears. We in Nova Scotia can hardly fathom the situation we find ourselves in now.

Pray for those on the front lines, for first responders, our police, paramedics, firefighters, homecare workers, doctors, nurses, mental health practitioners, all those who contribute to building up the human spirit as it seeks to find new life.
