Blessing the Children

This window depicts Jesus surrounded by children and a mother.

Inscription: "Suffer the little children to come to me." (Mark 10:14). The window is dedicated in memory of beloved Rector Noel Wilcox M.A., B.D., 1917 to 1932. He served Christ Church for 15 years before illness prevented further service. The original window designed by Robert McCausland Ltd., was erected by the parish in 1937.

This window was destroyed by the Magazine Hill ammunition depot explosion in 1945 and rebuilt at the same time as the **Crucifixion** and the **Good Shepherd** windows. The position of this window was swapped so that the baptismal font, which at that time was placed near the south vestry, would be closer to **Blessing the Children**.

Blessing the Children

In the Gospels of Mark, Matthew and Luke, Jesus explains that children are innocent, pure, and humble beings who trust and love freely. Because of their innocence, they can accept God wholly. Jesus explains to his disciples that to reach Heaven, they must accept God as children do. The body language of the children show they trust Jesus; while they may recognize him as their Lord, Jesus is essentially a stranger to them. The city in the background may be the city of Judea as the passages of the Gospels describe him as being in the region near Judea at the time of the blessing of the children..

The first Servant Song is appointed because Christians have seen in it a description of Jesus Christ, the one chosen by God to bring forth justice throughout the world. By baptism, believers are called into the way of Christ to be a new creation, to receive the name of God and become lights in the world.

This passage from Acts is chosen to coordinate with the gospel from Matthew 3. The sermon put into Peter's mouth places baptism as the beginning of Christian ministry. All who believe in the name of Jesus receive forgiveness.

Gospel Acclamation (vs 1 sung before and vs 2 sung after the Gospel reading)

At his baptism, Jesus hears the voice of God, receives the Spirit of God, and is acclaimed Son of God. For Christians, this narrative illumines Christian baptism, when believers also are adopted as children by the name of the triune God.

On July 31, 1942 the Women's Royal Canadian Naval Service (WRCNS) was established as part of the Royal Canadian Navy to "release a man to go to sea". At peak strength 6783 women were serving as Wrens and trained in 39 different trades. Come hear about the important contributions made by these women. The talk will be followed immediately by a Corn Chowder with roll, coffee or tea and a wartime dessert.
